



Governor's Mansion

This Beaux Arts mansion was modeled after Marie Antoinette's summer home, Petit Trianon, and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Not open for tours.

Floral Clock

West Lawn of the Capitol grounds, 502-564-3449

The colorful flowering clock was erected in May of 1961 by Gov. Bert Combs. The face of the clock is 34 ft. across and planted with thousands of plants and flowers.



Museums & History

Berry Mansion

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the mansion was built in 1900. This Colonial Revival mansion sits on a bluff overlooking the New State Capitol and the Capital City. Call for tour information.

Daniel Boone's Grave at Frankfort Cemetery

Site of Daniel & Rebecca Boone gravesites overlooking the City of Frankfort. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Buses must drop off passengers near the entrance. Large groups are requested to call to schedule a visit.

Frank Lloyd Wright-Ziegler House

509 Shelby St.

The only Frank Lloyd Wright designed house built in Kentucky. The 1910 "prairie style" house, is the only one designed during Wright's prairie period. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Not open for tours.

Green Hill Cemetery

East Main St., 502-696-0607

Established in 1865, the cemetery provides a unique link to Frankfort's African American Civil War heritage. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Kentucky Dept. for Libraries & Archives

The Archives research room maintains Kentucky's state and local government records available for reference use. Also available are genealogical, historical and legal references.

Kentucky Military History Museum

Explore Kentucky's military history in this fortress-like building that is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. All Kentucky Military History Museum tours begin at the Thomas D. Clark Center for Kentucky History.

Kentucky National Guard Memorial

This memorial is a large black granite stone in the shape of Kentucky that bears the names of Kentucky National Guard soldiers and airmen who have died in the line of duty. Parking available.

Kentucky State Police Museum

The museum is dedicated to the rich tradition and proud past of the Kentucky State Police. Memorabilia, vehicles, photographs, and weapons are displayed documenting trooper history and accomplishments.

Kentucky State University

Founded in 1886, Kentucky State University is one of the most diverse universities in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. As a land-grant institution, the university is known for its excellent programs in agriculture and aquaculture.

Kentucky Vietnam Veterans Memorial

365 Vernon Cooper Lane

One of the most original memorials in the country. The names of Kentuckians killed in Vietnam are engraved in granite below the memorial's sundial, where on the anniversary of each soldier's death, the point of the gnomon's shadow touches the veteran's name.

Leslie Morris Park on Fort Hill

Civil War earthen forts, picnic pavilion, scenic downtown overlooks, and hiking trails. Open to vehicular and foot traffic year-round. The Sullivan House interpretive center open Memorial Day to Oct. 31.

Liberty Hall Historic Site

A National Historic Landmark and listed on the National Register of Historic Places, this site features two historic houses built by Kentucky's first U.S. Senator, John Brown. Open mid-March to mid-November. Guided tours Mon.-Sat. The gardens, open daily dawn to dusk, are available for event rental.



Old Governor's Mansion

Home to 33 Kentucky governors from 1798 to 1914, this mansion is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and noted for the eight U.S. Presidents who have visited the home. Tours available by appointment 502-564-3000.

Old State Capitol

300 West Broadway, 502-564-1792 history.ky.gov

This National Historic Landmark served as Kentucky's Capitol from 1830 to 1910. This Greek Revival style building features a unique self-supporting stone staircase and was the only pro-Union State Capitol occupied briefly by the Confederate Army during the Civil War. Guided tours begin at the Thomas D. Clark Center for Kentucky History.

Switzer Covered Bridge

Off KY 1262 over North Elkhorn Creek


Built by George Hockensmith c.1855, this historic bridge is 126 ft. long, 11 ft. wide, and of Howe truss design. Each entrance has a saw tooth edge. Rebuilt in 1998, the bridge is on the National Register of Historic Places. Closed to traffic.


